


### John Crick, President, Extreme Pools

New technology is driving more creative pool design and making pool maintenance and operation much easier, and that makes the job more fun for John Crick. He points to the use of complete automation and saltwater pools as popular choices. "The salt systems pay for themselves by generating pure chlorine. The water is softer and maintains a lower chlorine residual. These pools are as low-maintenance as the floors in your home." John loves the hydraulics and design challenge, designing systems with water features as well as consistently delivering proper filtration without overpowering the system. He also enjoys coming up with inexpensive design extras, such as distinctive tile designs and water features, advanced LED lighting, or something as simple as a hole to anchor a beach umbrella in over a built-in sun shelf lounge area in the pool. "The best feeling is using the space available to give the customer something they will love for years to come." The downside to his job? "Not being able to swim around in and enjoy the final product." Extreme Pools also builds pools and waterfalls for other customers and builders.

### Casey Talley, Office Manager and Estimator

Casey has been with Kargar six years and is still learning on the job. "As a small team, we all have to be cross-trained and ready to help each other."
